

Dogwood

17 x 14 ½" with borders



Explore turning a drawing or photo into a turned edge machine appliqué that involves no sewing until the piece is ready to quilt. Using a fusible foundation, freezer paper for pattern pieces, textured fabric for the center, and tulle for shading, you can have fun building this little dogwood blossom.

Supplies Required:

- Scissors for paper and fabric,
- Pins
- Scotch tape
- Clear ruler at least 12 inches long.
- Glue stick
- A base to tape the paper pattern to. We'll be making just the flower which is 8 ½ x 11 inches so anything that size or larger will work – a cutting mat or even a piece of cardboard will work.
- Mechanical pencil
- Fine & extra fine black Sharpie markers
- Deco Bond or a lightweight fusible interfacing at least 8 ½ x 11 inches.
- Fabrics for your "sample"
 - Background, at least 10x12"
 - Petals, 4 at least 6x6"
 - Flower center (at least 5" x 5" if you want to create your own textured center. Instructor will have product available to purchase for texturing or will provide piece already done similar to the pictured sample.
 - Border fabrics optional. Actual sewing is done at home.

Will contain; pattern, direction handout, freezer paper, MistyFuse backed tulle, textured fabric for center, fusible interfacing for petal lining, parchment paper
