Nickel Quilts, More Nickel Quilts, Amazing Nickel Quilts and Nickel Quilts & Borders

Small Wonders Workshop Supply List

In this workshop you have the opportunity to make eight different quilts! All eight of these quilts are made with 5" squares.

I will have books and patterns with me available for purchase or you can order them from my website. www.patspeth.com

These are the lap sizes for the quilts; you can of course make yours larger.

Tillie's Treasure	66" x 66"	Star and Hourglass	56" x 56"
All That Glitters	63" x 77"	Star and Crown	66" x 66"
Butterfly Waltz	60" x 60"	South Dakota Star	54" x 54"
Prairie Gems	45" x 67"	Flying X	58" x 73"

The 5" squares listed below are enough to make a lap size quilt. You will need other materials later for sashing, borders, binding and backing to finish the quilt. Please feel free to make a larger size quilt and refer to the books or patterns for material requirements.

For those of you who may not have lots of 5" squares already cut; fat quarters are a great source for cutting 5" squares from. You can cut 12 - 5" squares from a fat quarter.

A "pair" is two squares from the same fabric

Tillie's Treasure is in *Nickel Quilts* and *The Big Book of Nickel Quilts*

Skill Level: Beginner Easy Intermediate

5" dark squares 49 pairs 16 singles (the singles are used in the border)

5" light squares 49 pairs 16 singles

All That Glitters is in *Nickel Quilts* and *The Big Book of Nickel Quilts*

Skill Level: Beginner Easy Intermediate

5" dark squares 66 pairs

5" light squares 66 pairs (this is your background fabric)

Butterfly Waltz is in *More Nickel Quilts* and *The Big Book of Nickel Quilts*

Skill Level: Beginner Easy Intermediate

– I used the same background (light) fabric in each of my blocks 1 ¾ yards of background fabric will be enough for a lap size quilt. Cut your background fabric into 5" squares.

5" dark squares 88

5" light squares 88 (this is your background fabric)

Star and Hourglass is in *More Nickel Quilts* and *The Big Book of Nickel Quilts*

Skill Level: Beginner Easy Intermediate

5" blue squares 32
5" red squares 40
5" light squares 97 (this is your background fabric)

Prairie Gems is in *Amazing Nickel Quilts* **Skill Level:** Beginner Easy Intermediate

5" dark and medium squares 8 sets of 4 (4 squares from the same fabric)
16 pairs 10 singles
5" light squares 8 sets of 6 (6 squares from the same fabric) this is your background fabric, I used shirtings

Flying X is in *Nickel Quilts & Borders* **Skill Level:** Beginner Easy Intermediate

– I used the same background (light) fabric in each of my blocks 2 1/3 yards of background fabric will be enough for a lap size quilt.

5" dark squares 35 pairs and 23 singles
5" light squares 93 (this is from your background fabric)

Star and Crown is an individual pattern **Skill Level:** Beginner Easy Intermediate

5" blue squares 50
5" red squares 83
5" light squares 131 (this is your background fabric)

South Dakota Star is an individual pattern **Skill Level:** Beginner Easy Intermediate

5" dark squares 81
5" light squares 72 (this is your background fabric)

Be sure to have your 5" squares cut before coming to class.

Bring a few extra light and dark 5" squares for practicing the technique and optional blocks.

Save any leftover pieces you may have at the end of your 5" strips after cutting them down into 5" squares. I have a great project for them!

Basic supplies:

- Sewing machine
- Basic Sewing Kit: scissors, pins, thread, seam ripper
- Rotary cutter and mat
- A mat that rotates or just a smaller mat that you can turn will come in handy but is not required.
- Rulers: one of the following: 4 1/2", 6", or 6 1/2" square with a 45° diagonal line that extends to the corners of the ruler if you already have one on hand. The Quilt in a Day square up ruler can be used as well as the Biased Square Ruler. Don't purchase a ruler yet for this class. I will be demonstrating 3 different rulers and will have them with me for purchase. You will be able to decide which one works the best for you.

- Any ruler that is at least 8" long
- A 4" square ruler if you are making the hourglass units or want to practice them. This is not required but it can come in handy and I will have some with me for sale.
- Pencil or other fabric marking devise for marking on the back of the fabric
- Iron and small ironing surface
- Design wall/surface (optional)*
- Power strip and extension cord
- Notepad & pencil
- A copy of *Nickel Quilts* or *The Big Book of Nickel Quilts* if you are making Tillie's Treasure or All That Glitters.
- A copy of *More Nickel Quilts* or *The Big Book of Nickel Quilts* if you are making the Star and Hourglass or the Butterfly Waltz quilts.
- A copy of *Amazing Nickel Quilts* if making Prairie Gems.
- A copy of *Nickel Quilts & Borders* if making Flying X.
- Sharing one of these books with a friend will be fine, but you will need to have access to the book for information on finishing your quilt or to make it in another size.
- If making Star and Crown or South Dakota Star the pattern for the quilt is needed. I will have the patterns with me.

*If you bring the supplies listed below I will show you how to put your design wall together.

- 1 dressmaker's cardboard cutting board (the kind that folds up for storage) when folded measures 14" x 40" and opens to 40" x 72"
- 2 curtain rods that extend to at least 72" (the white metal ones that curve on each end)
- a piece of flannel 44" x 80" or a flannel backed vinyl tablecloth
- 10 large binder clips 1" size (from the office supply store)

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
