

Teri's Favorite Pillow

Eight Sided Biscornu

Supplies

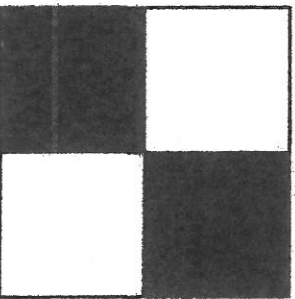
- 3 Fat Quarters or fabric totaling 1 yard
 - Thread to match
 - 1/2 yard fusible fleece
 - 2/3 yard 1/4" elastic
 - 32 oz bag of fiber fill
 - Small safety pin to insert elastic
 - Pinking shears
 - Sewing machine
- Basic sewing supplies including hand sewing needle and thread

Cutting Instructions

- From two of the fat quarters cut eight 8-1/2" squares (four from each fat quarter)
- Cut the remaining fat quarter into four pocket pieces using the pocket pattern.
- From the leftover scraps cut one 2-1/2" by 9" rectangle for the handle
- Cut a 16-1/2" square of fleece

Pillow Top

- Stitch four of the 8-1/2 squares together in a four-patch design.
- Layer this block over the piece of fusible fleece and with iron press to adhere fleece to block.
- Quilt as desired.
- With a ruler trim block to a 16" square.

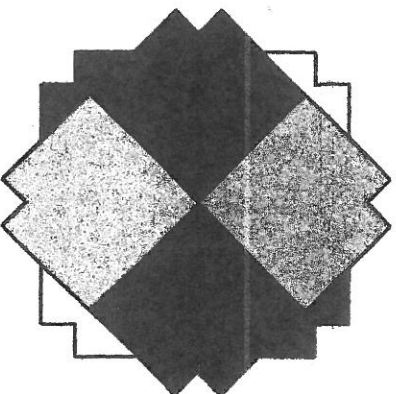


Pillow Bottom with Handle

- Press the 2-1/2" handle strip of fabric in half.
- Open it up so that fold runs down the middle of the strip.

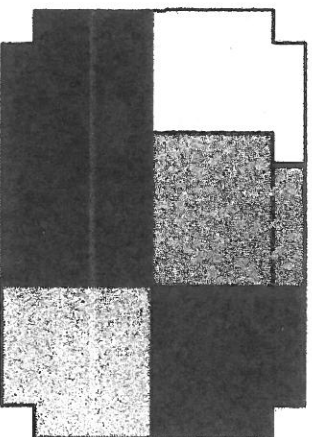
Lay quilted block on a flat work surface right side up with one pocket to the top right and one pocket to the bottom left. Referring to the following diagram lay the unquilted block right sides together over the quilted block.

To create the eight sides or points, you will be matching the corner notches of the unquilted square to the center line of the quilted square. And the centerline of the unquilted square to the corner notch of the quilted square.



Match up the top left corner of unquilted block to the center line at top of quilted block (this is where our four patch meets).

Stitch 1/4" with needle down if your sewing machine has that capability. Sew from the notch on the unquilted block to the center line of the unquilted block, this should also be where the quilted block corner notch is located. Pivot the quilted block with the needle down.



Stitch the along next section of unquilted block to it's next corner notch. This notch should fall at the next intersection of the quilted blocks four patch.

Continue to pivot and stitch until all four corner of the quilted block have been sewn. At the last corner only stitch 1" from corner and back stitch
