

sides in meeting the center fold line.

Refold strip in half and press.

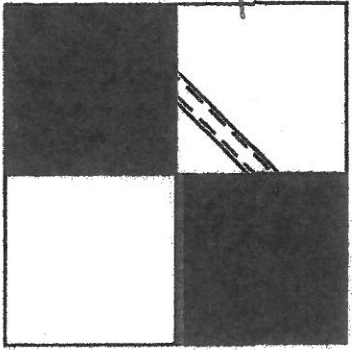
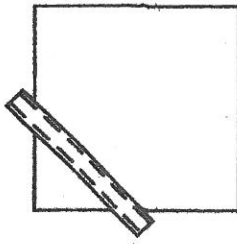
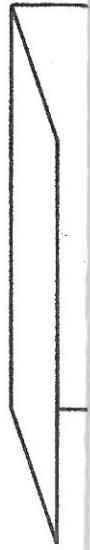
Top stitch 1/8" along both sides of strip.

Place this strip across one of the 8-1/2" squares 3-1/2" from edge.

Stay stitch 1/8" across ends and trim off excess fabric.

Stitch this block and the other three 8-1/2" blocks together into a four patch.

This 4 pc block is 16 1/2" square



Pockets

To construct two pockets sew right sides together along the top curved edge with a 1/4" seam allowance.

Trim selvage with pinking shears.

Turn pocket inside out and press.

Top stitch 1/8" away from curved edge.

Then top stitch again at 1/2" from edge. This creates the casing for the elastic.

Cut two pieces of elastic 9" long.

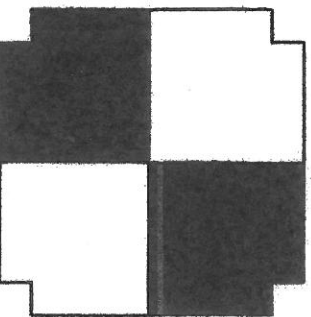
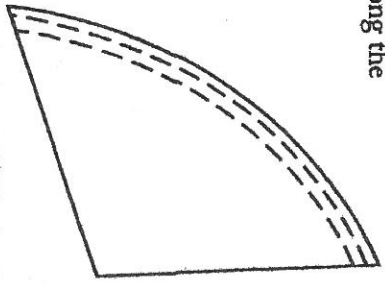
Attach small safety pin to one end of elastic and thread through the casing.

Place a pin at each end of the elastic to hold in place until it is sewn.

Pin pocket to quilted top of Pillow. This will distort the pillow a bit and it will no longer lay flat.

No worries.

Stay stitch pocket 1/8" along edge of pillow top to hold in place. Be sure to sew through the ends of the elastic to secure.



With scissors, cut a 1/4" notch on all four corners of each of the blocks. This

out.

Turn pillow inside out and check all the points.

If you are happy with the corners then stuff pillow with fiberfill. Push the filling into each of the corners of the pillow. Use the entire bag. Pillow will be very firm if you use the entire bag.

With needle and thread stitch the small opening we left open closed.

This pillow is perfect for hand sewing, reading, computer, phone, gaming... the list is endless. Soon you will be making them for everyone you know! And it will become your favorite Pillow too!

Need 1/2-2 inch to be able to turn inside out
