

## **Liberate the Log Cabin Workshop**

This workshop will demonstrate different techniques to create an improvisationally pieced log cabin block. Working with solid fabrics, students will learn to create curved inset pieces, ruler-free cutting techniques, free-form flying geese and more.

Using small blocks created with each technique, we will explore methods to join these units into a cohesive block that can be used as a small placement or table runner, or become part of a larger composition. Optional—students can create quilted hot cup cozies. I will have appropriate supplies available.

### Supplies needed:

- ∞ Sewing machine in working order
- ∞ Neutral thread
- ∞ Small cutting mat and small ruler
- ∞ Rotary cutter and scissors
- ∞ Recommended but not necessary: small personal iron
- ∞ 15-20 strips of solid fabrics – 5" x 21 or WOF
  - 5" is a suggested size. Please do not cut smaller than this, but you may bring uncut fat quarters and work from there.
- ∞ Optional project: template plastic and sharpie marker

Instructor will have packages of 5" strips available for purchase the day of the class.
